Best Practices – Agility Trials

Below is a list of Best Practices for the CIKC AKC Agility Trial to comply with the CDC and AKC Guidelines. We are committed to providing a safe environment for our exhibitors, workers, and judges. With that, below are some guidelines we will be following. These are subject to change without notice as new COVID-19 mandates are released.

Temperature Checks: An infrared temperature check will be required when first entering the building each day.

Building Limits: To comply with the State of AK, the maximum capacity of the building is 60 people. Please do not bring additional or unentered people to this event. We will be counting throughout the day to make sure we are in compliant. If we reach our limit, it will be a one-in-one-out situation.

Crating:

Limited crating will be available inside the building. Exhibitors will not be able to set up chairs next to their dog's crate. Priority crating will be available first to committee members, second to volunteers who sign up to work at least 4 classes a day or OR Covid-19 duties a day, and finally additional crating will be provided on a random lottery drawing basis. To stay within the required building limits, only exhibitors queuing up to for their scheduled times will be allowed in the building. No un-entered dogs will be allowed in the crating area. Please note: Sirius Ranch will be disinfecting the facility down each night after the trial. If you would like, you can bring a cover to drape over your crates to cover anything that you do not want sprayed. The CIK Club and Sirius Ranch are not responsible for any damages.

Car Crating - Tents/Shade Covering: You may set up a tent/shade covering around your vehicle. We will also have a designated area for parking for those crating out of their vehicles.

Trial Logistics:

Masks/Face Coverings: The CDC recommends that masks are worn when in close proximity to others. Masks will be required to be worn at all times in the building. Please be sure to adhere to CDC recommendations in order to make the trial as safe as possible. In addition, volunteers will be required to wear a mask while working.

Exhibitors will be required to wear a face covering during their runs. Face Shields: For the safety of others, face shields with an open bottom design and not worn with a mask, needs to have the

open area modified with something that catches droplets. It can be as simple as a bandana taped to the shield bottom edge and tied back around neck.

Check-In: The gate sheets will be posted normally, although only the gate steward may check your dog in. Form a line with proper social distancing in order to check your dog(s) in for their run(s).

Posting/Results Sheet: Results will be posted on the wall near the entrance and exit doors.

Course Maps: Course maps will be posted outside, emailed to the exhibitors each morning. Please plan on taking pictures of the maps. If you cannot take a picture of the maps, a limited supply of paper maps will be available.

Entry/Exit Gates: When lining up to go into the ring for your run, there will be 6ft markers by the entry gate.

Walk-Throughs: To be determined based on entries at time of closing. Decisions will be made to provide enough social distance on course between exhibitors. Per AKC's suggestions, walk-throughs will be limited to a maximum of 25 exhibitors.

Leashes: There are two options:

Option 1: The Leash Runner will use a "grabber" to move your leash to the end of the course. Your leash will be placed on the ground. The "grabber" will be wiped down each time it's used.

Option 2: You can place your leash in your pocket, around your neck, or around your waist per AKC.

If the dog grabs the leash while running or the leash falls out of your pocket, this will be scored as an "E".

The next dog will not enter the ring until the previous dog is leashed up.

Briefing: General briefing will not occur in the ring. A PA system may be used to deliver the briefing. Please gather, using proper social distancing, outside the ring.

Ribbons/Awards: Ribbons are no longer self-serve. They will be prepared and placed on the wall with clothes pins near the entrance and exit doors.

Food: Food will not be served at the trial. Please plan accordingly. As per AKC guidelines, no MACH/PACH cakes are allowed at the trial; however, cupcakes can be served.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only.

A warm-up area, consisting of one regulation agility jump for each ring, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

Class Changes Effective January 1, 2020

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

As of January 1, 2020, For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is only allowed in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter in T2B and/or FAST. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.

- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring
 - Toys must be non-audible
 - Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time – Time is course time – not max course time.

Fix and Go On (FNG)

As of January 1, 2020, Fix and Go On will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on a dirt surface. Ring size will be 100 X 90 .

DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under six months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

PRIZES

Ribbons for first, second, third, fourth places, Qualifying Score, and New Title. MACH and titling ribbons will be awarded. Double Q pins will be available for QQ in Master classes or QQ in premier classes.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

This trial will be held under AKC rules and regulations for agility trials. Exhibitors are expected to be familiar with these rules and regulations.

Jump Height Cards: All dogs (except with AKC jump height cards) **MUST** be measured by the judge before their **first** run. Measuring will take place at 8:00 a.m. If your dog is measured into a taller jump class, he must be moved up into it at the trial. **If your dog is measured down, he cannot move into a lower jump class!**

Jump Height Card Process: There is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog has a valid jump height card or if your dog needs to be measured. Please check the appropriate box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the *Dogs To Be Measured List*.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the event committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Cook Inlet Kennel Club, Sirius Ranch and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or

handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injured children. The Clubs reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Cook Inlet Kennel Club, Sirius Ranch or any official thereof.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course. No Flexi leads are allowed on the property at Sirius Ranch. Dogs should not be off leash up around the Log Cabin, please be mindful of the private residence.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in an event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Event Committee.

There will be no refunds withdrawn after the closing date. If the dog handler is dismissed from the competition, regardless of the reason there will be no refund.

Bitches in Season shall not be eligible to participate. There will be a refund except for an administrative fee per day.

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of the class if a VMO or AKC Field Rep is available to measure dogs. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner/handler of each dog is so responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

Parents or Guardians must be responsible for children. Children must be kept under supervision of an adult at all times.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.
