ENTRIES CLOSE Friday, Oct. 2, 2020, at 10 PM after which time entries cannot be accepted, canceled, altered or substituted except as provided for in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows. Withdrawn entries are subject to a refund as allowed in Chapter 1, Section 9 and/or Chapter 1, Section 16 of the Regulations for Agility Trials. Envelopes/transactions containing entries for more than the ten (10) dog maximum and/or entries received prior to the opening date shall be treated as an invalid entry and shall be returned to the sender.

COVID-19 Special Instructions

Below are the current guidelines KKC will be following to comply with the CDC, AKC and Sirius Ranch protocols. These are subject to change without notice as new COVID-19 mandates are released.

- **Temperature Checks:** An infrared temperature check will be required when first entering the building each day.
- **Building Limits:** To comply with the state, the maximum capacity of the building is 60 people. We will be counting throughout the day to make sure we are compliant. If we reach the limit, it will be a one-in/one-out situation. **NO GUESTS** are allowed; the trial is open to exhibitors only.
- **Crating:** Limited crating will be available inside the building. Exhibitors will not be able to set up chairs next to their crate. Priority crating is available first to committee members and second to volunteers who sign up for 4 or more classes a day or have COVID-19 duties. Additional crating will be by random drawing. To stay within the required building limits, only exhibitors queuing up for their scheduled times will be allowed in the building. No un-entered dogs are allowed in the crating area. Sirius Ranch will disinfect the facility each night. Bring a cover to drape over anything you do not want sprayed. Sirius Ranch is not responsible for any damages.
- **Car Crating - Tents/Shade Covering:** You may set up a tent/shade covering around your vehicle. There also will be a designated area for parking for those crating out of their vehicles.
- **Masks/Face Coverings:** Masks are required to be worn at all times in the building. Be sure to adhere to CDC recommendations in order to make the trial as safe as possible. **Exhibitors will be required to wear a face covering during their runs.** **Face Shields:** For the safety of others, face shields with an open bottom design and not worn with a mask need to have the open area modified with something that catches droplets. It can be as simple as a bandana taped to the shield bottom edge and tied back around the neck.
- **Check-In:** The gate sheets will be posted normally, although only the gate steward may check your dog in. Form a line with proper social distancing in order to check them in for their run(s).
- **Posting/Results Sheet:** Results will be posted on the wall near the entrance and exit doors.

- **Course Maps:** Course maps will be posted outside and emailed to exhibitors each morning. Plan on taking pictures of them. If you cannot, a limited supply of maps will be available.
- **Entry/Exit Gates:** When lining up to go into the ring for your run, there will be 6-foot markers by the entry gate.
- **Walk-Throughs:** To be determined based on entries at time of closing. Decisions will be made to provide enough social distance on course between exhibitors. Per AKC's suggestions, walk-throughs will be limited to a maximum of 25 exhibitors.
- **Leashes: Option 1:** The Leash Runner will use a "grabber" to move your leash to the end of the course. Your leash will be placed on the ground. The "grabber" will be wiped down each time it's used. **Option 2:** You can place your leash in your pocket, around your neck, or around your waist per AKC. If the dog grabs the leash while running or the leash falls out of your pocket, this will be scored as an "E". The next dog will not enter the ring until the previous dog is leashed up.
- **Briefing:** A PA system may be used for the general briefing, and folks should stay outside the ring.
- **Ribbons/Awards:** Ribbons are no longer self-serve. They will be prepared and placed on the wall with clothespins near the entrance/exit doors.
- **Food:** Food will not be served at the trial. Per AKC guidelines, no MACH/PACH cakes are allowed at the trial, but cupcakes can be served.

The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower or higher height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

If there is a VMO present **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials.

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the **Judge of Record** PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" or 26" height division. However, if a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** is present; **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog **before** its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

NEW Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether the dog has a valid jump height card or if the dog needs to be measured. Please check the appropriate box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include the dog entered on the *Dogs To Be Measured List*. It is no longer required that a copy of a dog's jump height card be submitted with an entry form or show it at check-in; although exhibitors are required to have the official form/card with them at the trial to present upon request.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under six months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on a DIRT surface. Ring size will be 100' x 90'.

No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry.

ONLINE VS. PAPER ENTRY PRIMARY LIMITS

Kenai Kennel Club is accepting online entries through K9trialsonline.com. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online entries or paper entries will be as follows: Online Entries: 50%; Paper entries: 50%. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48-hour time period, the club reserves the right to adjust the limits as they see fit.

No hand deliveries will be accepted in the first twenty-four hours following the opening date and time.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION (if offered)

The Kenai Kennel Club is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 20 entries will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including wait-listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to **Sept 20, 2020, at 9 p.m.** Any entries withdrawn that are received by **Sept 20, 2020 at 9 p.m.** will be replaced by a wait-listed entry if any are available. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait-listed entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry. Any wait-listed entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial by **Sept 20, 2020, at 9 p.m.** will receive a full refund.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings, may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent.

A warm-up area, consisting of one regulation agility jump for each ring, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

Class Changes Effective January 1, 2020

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

As of January 1, 2020, For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is only allowed in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter in T2B and/or FAST. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).

- Toys are allowed in the ring
- Toys must be non-audible
- Toys may not leave the handler's hand
- Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time – Time is course time – not max course time. **Fix and Go On (FNG)**. As of January 1, 2020, Fix and Go On will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score. Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Ribbons will be awarded in each jump height division in each class as follows:

Trophies: MACH, PACH and PAX rosettes and titling ribbons will be awarded.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The **safety of the dog** is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the event committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Kenai Kennel Club, Sirius Ranch and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Kenai Kennel Club **reserves** the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Kenai Kennel Club or Sirius Ranch or any official thereof.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

Move-Ups

Move up to a higher class will be allowed if received by the Trial Secretary in writing by **Monday, Oct. 5, 2020, at 6 p.m. AST**. E-mail and text is acceptable. Move-ups for Saturday and Sunday will be allowed if received by the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of end of judging on the previous day at the trial site.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Event Committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in agility trials. As such, the club will refund entry fee/s paid for bitches unable to compete for this reason upon presentation of a veterinarian certificate. This certificate must be presented to the Trial Secretary prior to the start of judging on the first day of the trial or cluster of trials.

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class if a VMO or AKC Field Rep is available to measure dogs. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner/handler of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

CATALOGS

Advance catalog sales may be ordered and prepaid on your entry form for \$10.00. Run order sheets will be available to all exhibitors at no charge.

VENDORS

This club agrees to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Crating space will be available on a limited basis. The trial site requires a tarp to be placed on the floor underneath your crates. Crates may be left overnight; however, the Kenai Kennel Club and Sirius Ranch will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

Loud (barking, whining, etc.) dogs need to be crated in the arena area.
