COVID-19 INFORMATION

Exhibitors, judges, and volunteers will be required to comply with all CDC, State and local mandates in place at the time of the event. If the entire event must be cancelled because of COVID-19, all entry fees will be refunded.

There may not be a food vendor so plan accordingly.

CLASSES OFFERED

Outdoors two rings, Rings will alternate so no rings run at the same time, starting each day with Ring 1. Preferred classes will run with the corresponding regular classes and height divisions. Master and Excellent classes will run together

First Received–Entries accepted in order of receipt: “Paper and Online Limits” The “initial limits” are valid for the first 48 hours after the opening date. 50% of the entries will be accepted via paper entries. 50% of the entries will be accepted via on-line or email entries.

- Illegible, incomplete or incorrect entries will not be accepted.

- Entries not on official AKC forms or photocopies of AKC forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side will not be accepted.

- Entries may be sent by US mail (with signature waiver).
- **E-mail confirmations will be sent only to those listing a legible email address on the entry form.**
- Judging Schedule and confirmation will be sent to the email address on the entry form. If the Judging Schedule has not been received by five days prior to the trial, please contact the trial secretary.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Unless AKC issues a change in Covid-19 policies, there will not be height measurements at this trial as this judge is not a VMO. Unless there is a judge change announcement, dogs without a valid Jump Height Card or temporary Form must jump the height they best fit into. Use your best judgment.

MOVE UPS

For move-ups prior to trial, the trial secretary must receive request by **5:00 p.m., Monday, August 1, 2022**. The following information must be provided: Owner's name, dog's registered name and call name, AKC registration number, breed, class currently entered, and new class requested. Move-ups will be official only when confirmation is received by the requesting party.

For day to day move-ups, trial secretary must receive completed form (available from secretary) by 30 minutes after close of judging on Friday & Saturday.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded to dogs placing first through fourth place in each height division of each class. Ribbons will be awarded to each dog that receives a qualifying score.

Ribbons will be offered to any dog completing a new title.

Ribbons or pin will be offered to any dog completing a Double Q Score.

Ribbon or Rosette will be offered to any dog completing the MX or MXJ title.

Rosette will be offered to any dog completing the MACH, PACH, or PAX title.

High In Trial and runner-up JWW and High In Trial and runner-up JWW(P) will be chosen from the JWW & JWW(P) dog that has the best yards per second qualifying score. Prize will be \$25 for each winner and \$10 for the runner-up for Friday and Saturday. Prize will be awarded at the briefing the next morning.

One toy will be offered to each Novice dog entered per weekend.

ISC awards provided by Woodland Wellness Center: Ribbons will be awarded to dogs placing first through fourth place in each height division of each class. Ribbons will be awarded to each dog that receives a qualifying score. Special trophies will be available for placements 1-3 in each jump height.

All proceeds of the ISC class will go to support the AKC World Team which includes our own Wynn and her handler Michaela Krohn.

AGILITY GATE APP CHECK IN, RUN ORDERS AND MAPS

On each trial day after 6am you can check in via the **Agility Gate App**. Instructions and pass code are sent out with the final entry confirmations. If you need to move a dog, click "conflict" and contact the gate steward before the briefing and walk thru. After the run order is posted on the App, the Gate Steward is the **ONLY** person to move dogs. All moves must be within AKC rules and with permission of the judge. The TV displaying the current run order and dogs in queue will be displayed near the rings. The Gate Steward will be at a table near the rings and please respect the space around the steward's station. The only time you may need to approach is if you can't access the App or need to move a dog.

Maps will not be emailed instead available via the Agility Gate App after 6am. Maps will be posted. If you need a printed map, please contact the trial secretary so we don't have to continue to waste paper and ink.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

We would like this event to be a pleasant experience for all in attendance. We ask your cooperation, please, in the following areas: This trial will be held under AKC rules and regulations for agility trials. **Exhibitors are expected to be familiar with these rules and regulations.**

At the handler's option, dogs may run a course with or without a collar. The only collars allowed when running a course are flat buckle or rolled leather collars, but there shall be no attachments hanging or otherwise

allowed on the collar. This shall not preclude painted or stitched designs or information on the collar. Dog's names and/or identifying information may appear on the collar.

Participants who leave dogs, equipment and personal belongings unattended, do so at their own risk. The show giving club(s) and the owner(s) of the site will not be responsible for dogs, equipment or personal belongings, nor for the loss of, damage to, or death of any dog, whether the result of accident or any other cause.

All dogs must be kept on leash, in crates or in vehicles at all times except when competing.

Participants will be responsible for clean conditions (**including picking up after the dogs in their care**) around crates, tents and parking spaces.

Dogs must be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged or in any way has anything attached to it for medical purposes.

Bitches in season shall not be eligible to participate, notify the trial secretary and the club will refund of entry fees only in this case.

Entry fee will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the judge or veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee.

No entry fees will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the club.

Dogs must be ready to compete. The judge need not wait for any dog that is not ready to compete when it is called by the gate steward. The judge will take a lunch break at a convenient time.

Participants shall be governed by any rules and regulations of civil authorities and/or location restrictions. Please obey all posted signs.

Parents or guardians are responsible for children who must be kept under supervision of an adult at all times.

Vehicles will be allowed to park in designated areas only. Vehicles parked in undesignated areas will be towed immediately at the owner's expense. NO vehicles may be parked overnight.

All rights to televise, videotape, advertise, photograph, promote or otherwise exploit these events are vested in the Club or in persons to whom assignments of such rights have been made in writing by the Club.

All persons & animals on the show grounds at any time while the shows are in progress do, by attending these shows or participating therein, hereby grant to the Club the right to photograph, televise, videotape or otherwise use their likeness & voice in any manner without further release or consent.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

A complete set of rules and current full class descriptions are available on the AKC website (www.akc.org) or by request from the American Kennel Club, 5580 Centerview Drive, Suite 200, Raleigh, NC 27606.

Dogs may be entered in any height division they are eligible for but may only enter each class offered once per day. If a dog is entered in different jump heights the owner must submit separate entry forms, one for each height.

24C"	n/a	<u>Dogs may be entered at this height at their owner's discretion if their measurement is 22 inches and under at the withers.</u> Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice.

The owner may choose to enter their dog in Preferred classes and Regular classes at the same trial. A dog may only be entered once in each class offered. They may not enter a class in both Preferred and Regular.

If a dog is entered in Preferred and Regular classes the owner must submit two separate entry forms, one for Regular classes and one for Preferred classes. After the close of entry for a trial a dog may not be moved between Regular and Preferred classes except as noted in Chapter 1, Section 21.

Entering “For Exhibition Only” (FEO)

If allowed by AKC, FEO will be offered in the Time 2 Beat class and is non-qualifying.

- The exhibitor must enter T2B prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) but does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show to the Gate Steward.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out.
- Toys are allowed in the ring
 - Toys must be non-audible
 - Toys may not leave the handler’s hand
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time – Time is course time – not max course time.

Fix and Go On (FNG)

If allowed by AKC, Fix and Go On will be for all classes. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog’s performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

International Sweepstakes Class (ISC)

Purpose: The International Sweepstakes Class (ISC) is a non-regular class providing the dog and handler an opportunity to demonstrate their advanced training and handling skills on various International Style Standard and Jumpers with Weaves courses. The rules for this class are generally based on international rules. The variety in International Agility course designs is very diverse, so handlers should be prepared to meet the "Challenge of the

Day" when competing in the ISC class. The total challenge level may be easier, more difficult, or simply different from what is currently allowed in Excellent / Master Class. Complete rules for the ISC are available from the AKC Website (<http://www.akc.org>).

This is not a Regional World Team Qualifying event. Results are not submitted to AKC so you can run this event "For Exhibition Only). See FEO on previous page.

Eligibility: These classes are open to **ANY LEVEL** dog registered with AKC. **There is no Preferred Option for ISC; dogs may enter at their preferred jump height; however, they will be scored against the regular division dogs jumping the same jump height.**

Jump Heights: Dogs **may** be entered in their regular jump heights, however, only those dogs running in the 12" & 16" class that meet the FCI/ISC measuring cutoff (different than regular AKC cutoffs) as follows:

- Small (12" jump height) - for dogs measuring 13 3/4" or less at the withers
- Medium (16" jump height) - for dogs measuring more than 13 3/4" but less than 16 7/8" at the withers
- Large (24" jump height) - for dogs measuring over 16 7/8" at the withers

Qualifications: A "clean run" consists of a run without time or course faults.

Minimum YPS requirements are waived for these scores, as long as the dog is under the course time set by the judge for that class.

Basic differences in scoring: You are not eliminated for a dropped bar or refusal but you are added 5 points to your time for each bar or refusal. Only a wrong course is an elimination and the judge stops judging but you may finish the course. For more information see Regulations for Agility trials and Agility course tests section Chapter 14.
